

About the Cover

This African American male with open angle glaucoma received a trabeculectomy and filter procedure. He was closely followed and the filtering bleb on his left eye grew slowly in height and eventually started to overhang the cornea. Surgical revision of the bleb was performed and this photograph was taken prior to the surgery. The specimen taken during surgery showed non-keratinized stratified squamous epithelium with goblet cells overlying fibrovascular tissue with some inflammatory cells present.
